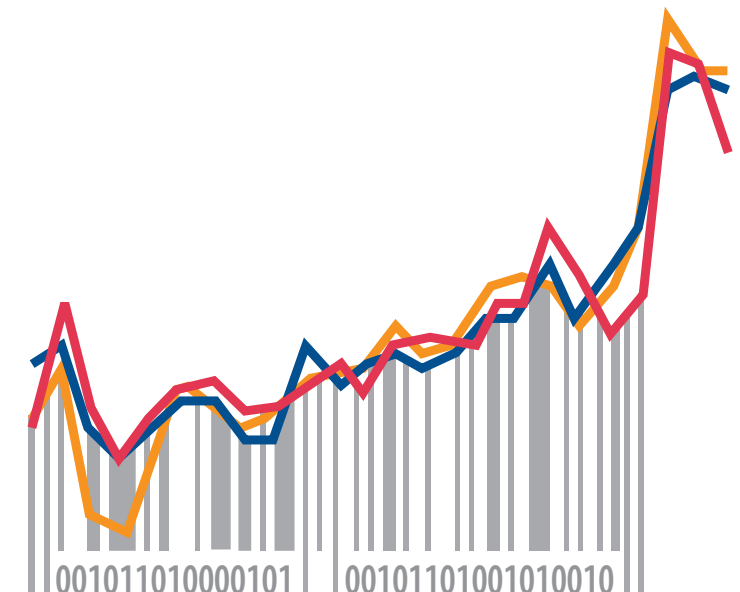

## ■ BACKGROUND:

Just over two years after the 2008 food price crisis, in recent months the international community has been concerned again about high food price levels on international markets. Many governments, international agencies and producers organizations are currently involved in debates about food price volatility and what policy responses may mitigate it and reduce its impact on poor consumers. Farmers' organizations are likewise asked how price volatility impacts small-scale producers. What causes food price volatility? What policies and programs can help mitigate food price volatility?

Rice is the staple food of the ASEAN people. ASEAN is home to the world's top exporters and importers of rice. It is very important that we have stable supply of good and affordable rice in our country and in the region. Our production of rice has been hampered by many factors, including climate change and natural disasters. The ASEAN is improving its Rice Reserve Scheme. National governments are increasing buffer stocks. Local communities likewise are strengthening local stocks. Are food reserve schemes an effective strategy to minimize price volatility? If so, how should these schemes be implemented at national and ASEAN levels?

## ■ OBJECTIVES:

1. Understand the effects of price volatility to small producers and poor consumers
2. Analyze the causes of food price volatility in ASEAN countries
3. Analyze the ASEAN Rice Reserve Scheme
4. Formulate policy and program proposals addressed to national governments and ASEAN that will reduce food price volatility
5. Develop joint and complementary actions amongst civil society groups, and between CSO and ASEAN , and identify possible mechanisms for coordination
